SUBJECT: Update on the Winchester Class IV Bikeway September 24 Community Meeting

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the Commission receive an update on the Winchester Class IV Bikeway Community Meeting held on September 24.

BACKGROUND:

The Connect Los Gatos Program is aimed at making it easier and safer for all to bike and walk in Los Gatos. Two projects that are included in the Connect Los Gatos Program are the Winchester Class IV Bikeway and the Winchester Boulevard Complete Streets. Both projects propose improvements to transform the corridor to improve safety and connections for motorists, bicyclists and pedestrians and to encourage more bicycling and walking trips. Class IV Bikeway, referred to as protected bikeway, is an interim solution to safe bike routes on Winchester Boulevard that can be implemented as early as next year, while Complete Streets will take few years to develop and secure construction funding. The budget appropriated in the FY2020-21 Capital Improvement Program for the Class IV Bikeway project is \$982,455 of which \$293,900 is grant funded. Kimley-Horn and Associates, Inc. (KHA) is working on the design for both projects.

Staff established that a limited pavement section repair is required on Winchester to install the protected bikeways. Hence, the project limits for the Winchester Class IV Bikeway will be resurfaced as part of the Annual Street Repair and Resurfacing project in 2021 before the bikeway installation.

BACKGROUND (continued):

On September 10, 2020, CSTC was presented with the 35% design plans for the Winchester Class IV Bikeway. The commissioners were in general support of the project and requested that staff obtain early feedback from the public regarding the design.

DISCUSSION:

Staff held a community meeting via Zoom on Thursday, September 24 to present the 35% design plans for the Winchester Class IV Bikeway Project. Outreach efforts for the community meeting involved direct mailing, door hanger flyers, social media, flyers placed near the project site, and the Town website. Monte Sereno community members were also invited since a segment of the project is within the City of Monte Sereno right-of-way.

Approximately 28 community members from the Town and Monte Sereno attended the meeting including the Mayor of Monte Sereno. The attendees were presented with the project background and goals, key design features including protected/buffered bikeways and travel lane changes, reduction to parking, modifications at intersections, and next steps.

During the Q&A session that followed, a few attendees expressed appreciation and support for the interim solution to safer bikeways before the future Complete Streets project on Winchester Blvd. Attendees also asked questions and provided feedback/concerns on the following matters

- Project limit not extending to Knowles Drive
- Removal of parking along Winchester for residents and business
- Driveway access directly from Winchester
- Travel lane reduction
- Lack of sidewalk improvements for pedestrians as part of the project
- Traffic delays at intersections, especially at Winchester and Lark

Attendees expressed desires to have continued bikeways up to Knowles Drive and connected sidewalks for pedestrian usage, which is not part of the current scope of the bikeway or resurfacing project. The current limits of the Winchester Class IV Bikeway for northbound is between Blossom Hill Road and Albright Way and between Wimbledon Drive and Blossom Hill Road for southbound. Bikeways beyond the limits would need to be addressed as part of the Complete Streets or other future projects due to funding limitations and coordination challenges to install by next year. Staff will also conduct further traffic analysis at the intersection of Winchester and Lark to determine impacts to the level of service. Community members were informed that staff and the design consultant will continue to improve the 35% design plans, but certain changes such as reduction of parking and travel lanes will be required to install protected bike lanes.

SUBJECT: Highway 9 and Massol Avenue Intersection Improvements

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the Commission receive an update on the Highway 9 and Massol Avenue Intersection Improvements

BACKGROUND:

The Town Council authorized the Town Manager to proceed with the Highway 9 Corridor Study, that included the area between Los Gatos Boulevard to the east and the Town limits to the west at Monte Sereno, with an emphasis on safety and vehicle flow. The study addressed the corridor in segments with the intersection at Massol Avenue and Highway 9 identified as a prime focus of the study due to safety issues, including a pedestrian fatality on September 1, 2017. The intersection currently has no traffic control but is equipped with pedestrian activated flashing beacons intended to alert drivers when a pedestrian is crossing.

At the August 21, 2018 meeting, the Town Council reviewed the Highway 9 Corridor Study recommendations and directed staff to move forward with upgrading the existing flashing beacons at the intersection of Massol Avenue with the LED rectangular rapid flashing beacons (RRFB's) and additional safety improvements. RRFB's are utilized at other crosswalks in the Town to provide high visibility of crosswalks for drivers.

DISCUSSION:

The Massol Intersection Improvements project will upgrade the existing pedestrian crossing and bicycle facilities on Highway 9 at Massol Avenue to improve safety, promote greater walking and biking in Downtown Los Gatos, and enhance access to the surrounding residential

neighborhood. After the completion of the Highway 9 Corridor Study in 2018, the Town has designed the safety improvement project, which includes the following measures:

1. Visual narrowing of the roadway to slow traffic with a landscaped median island on Highway 9 west of the intersection.
2. Replacement of existing pedestrian activated flashing beacons with higher visibility LED rectangular rapid flashing beacons (RRFB).
3. Upgrade the existing speed feedback sign and add a new flashing beacon on the eastbound approach.
4. Installation of green bike lanes on the eastbound and westbound sections of Highway 9 near the crosswalk.
5. Installation of a streetlight closer to the crosswalk for improved visibility.
6. Add "Shark Teeth" yield lines and new signs at the eastbound and westbound approaches.
7. Removal of two magnolia trees for improved visibility.

These improvements are consistent with the Town's goal to improve pedestrian and bicyclist safety by enhancing the existing pedestrian crossing, encouraging speed adherence by design, increasing visibility of pedestrians and bicyclists, and enhancing lighting.

On June 2, 2020, the Town Council approved the plans and specifications for the Massol Intersection Improvements and authorized the advertising of the project for bid. On July 1, 2020, the Town received three (3) bids for the project. Tennyson Electric, Inc. was deemed the lowest responsive and responsible bidder. On August 4, Council awarded the construction contract with Tennyson Electric for \$328,792.00 with additional \$65,578 budget authorized for construction contingency.

Highway 9 is under the jurisdiction of the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans). Staff had to obtain necessary Caltrans approval and permits required for the intersection improvements. The necessary permits are now secured, and Tennyson Electric will start work in October. The project is anticipated to be completed by early next year.

The next steps include notifying the community regarding the construction work, implementing necessary traffic control when necessary, and completing the project by early 2021.
