## Connect Los Gatos Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan Update

### Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan Update

Connect Los Gatos is a public engagement initiative that promotes bicycle and pedestrian projects that are all part of a big picture effort to provide connected multi-modal routes through the Town. Since the adoption of the Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan (BPMP) in March 2017, the Town has made substantial progress in implementing the Plan’s priorities. The update reflects an important step in the assuring the Connect Los Gatos program’s long-term success.

#### Purpose

The goal of this BPMP update is to create a platform for the public, commissioners, and staff to use to gain an understanding of current, past, and future pedestrian and cyclist improvement projects. Updating the Town’s BPMP will better reflect the Connect Los Gatos Projects and ensure that there is consistency between the town’s current programs and the towns long range goals. It will also provide meaningful context to support future funding opportunities and decision making. The update will also introduce an online interactive map and updated project tables.

#### Project Scope

The scope of work includes:

1. A focused update to reflect the accomplishments and the Connect Los Gatos program
2. Update Chapter 4, Network Recommendations and Project Prioritization
3. Create an online interactive map to better illustrate project information and facilitate community engagement
4. Create a format that will allow staff to make timely updates about projects status, budget, and funding.

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Hello,

This is "sort of" 8E. With regards to the Los Gatos portion of the LG Creek Trail, there are a few areas that could be easily improved for safety.

- Top of trail at Lake Vasona Dam
  - Marking lines that say "Keep Clear".
    - A lot of people seem to hang out at the area blocking the trail. It's unsafe.
- Trail intersection in Vasona Park where train enters the park
  - Similarly people seem to slow down and look around here. Wording and marking like the item above would be helpful.
- Trail leading up to the top of the Lake Vasona Dam from the north
  - This one is a bit more work to fix. If it could be made even 2 feet wider, it would really help for bikes and pedestrians, working to get that hill through a crowd. Wider in general would be great, but here it would really improve safety.
  - Also.....the curve at the bottom should be marked as a blind corner with double lines in both directions. Maybe a slow sign on the downhill.
- General signage
  - Occasionally reminding everyone that they should step off the trail if they area going to stop.
  - Also, lots of people don't remember to walk/ride on the right. Many of those signs are missing.
  - A few signs saying to keep your dog on a short leash.

I know there are concerns about the mountain biking area, but I don't use that. In general, want to have pedestrians and bikers use the trail more cooperatively and safely.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

Review and comment on the draft Connect Los Gatos Project List, a list of prioritized bicycle and pedestrian improvements in the Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan Update.

**BACKGROUND:**

At the June 11 meeting, the Complete Streets and Transportation Commission received a verbal report from staff on the Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan (BPMP) update. The goal of the focused update is to better reflect the Connect Los Gatos Projects and ensure that there is consistency between the current bike and pedestrian priorities and the Town's long range goals. It will also provide meaningful context to support future funding opportunities and decision making.

Since the adoption of the BPMP in 2017 the Town has continuously made progress in implementing priority projects identified by the community. Projects that have been completed will be documented in the BPMP update.

**DISCUSSION:**

The Connect Los Gatos Project List is an update from the prioritized bicycle and pedestrian projects in the BPMP and an expansion of the first six Connect Los Gatos projects. These projects are aimed at expanding access to key destination points in the community, improving the Town's existing network by closing connectivity gaps and providing safe access and crossings. The draft list not only reflects the Town's current bicycle and pedestrian improvement priorities, but also provides a comprehensive geographic coverage.

At the July 9 meeting, staff will present the draft Connect Los Gatos Project List (Attachment 1) and solicit feedback from the Commission. Tables 4.9 and 4.9 of the 2017 BPMP, the prioritized bicycle and pedestrian project lists, are included for reference as Attachment 2.

One exciting product from the update is an online platform that includes interactive maps and project information. This platform will provide a user-friendly approach for the community to

identify the projects by location and have access to project information and updates. Staff will demonstrate a test version of the online map at the July 9 meeting.

NEXT STEPS:

As a way to engage the community and increase awareness for the Connect Los Gatos Program, PPW staff is conducting an Active Transportation Survey to:

- Better understand how residents are using the streets to meet their needs
- Hear suggestions on improvements what will make biking and walking safer for all
- Understand how the community travels
- Help inform the Bike and Pedestrian Master Plan Update

In contrast to several past school-related survey and polling activities, this one is open to everyone in the community. Interested individuals can find the link via the social media posts or from the Connect Los Gatos website. The survey will remain open until July 24th.

Staff will continue to provide progress reports to the Commission and Town Council in the summer, targeting a completion date in the fall.
