Spring and Summer are great times to get together with your neighbors. Please let us know if you are planning a picnic or meeting in your neighborhood and we can schedule a visit.

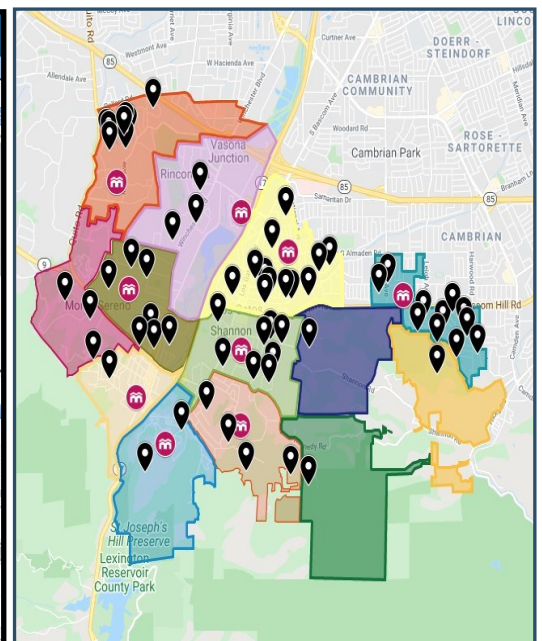
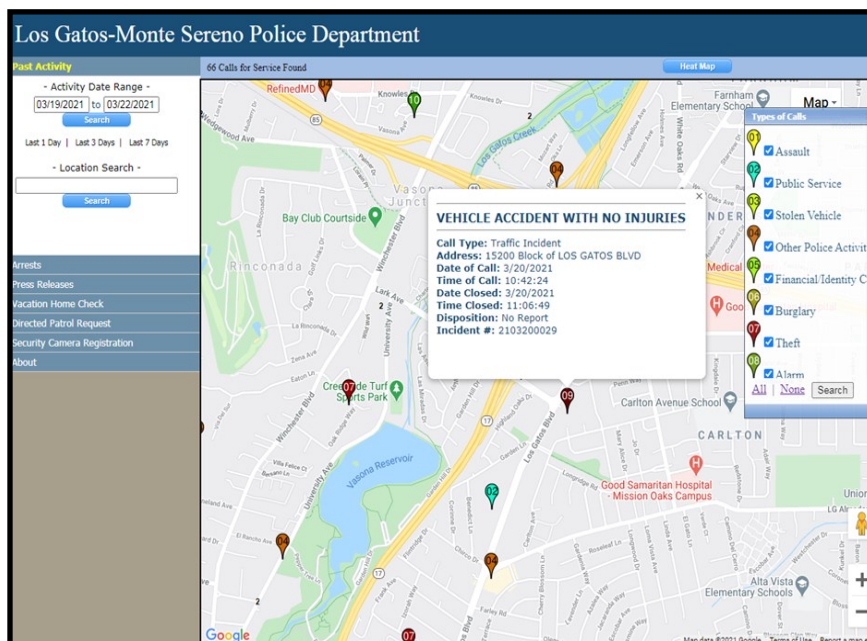
National Night Out

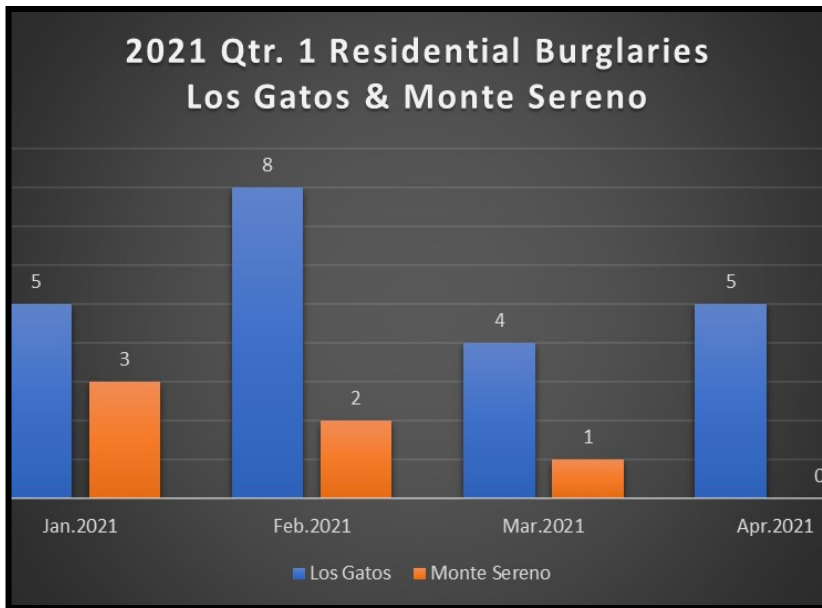

Burglary Crime Trends Quarter 1: January 2021—April 2021



RESIDENTIAL BURGLARIES—Qtr.1

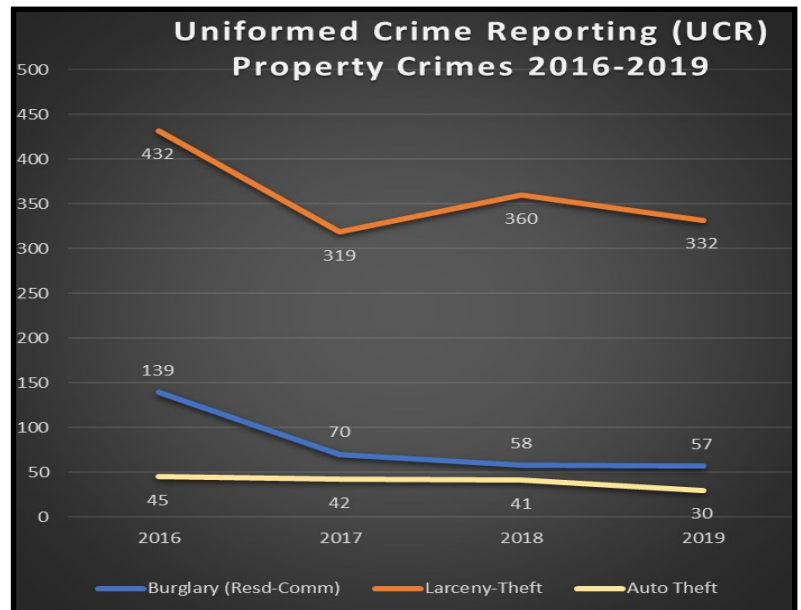
- More than 60% of residential burglaries in Qtr. 1 were committed via forced entry—glass break to a rear or side door to the residence.
- Suspects in residential burglaries will often ring doorbells to see if anyone is at home before making entry.
- Side yard gates were accessed to gain entry onto the property.
- Suspects in recent burglaries targeted high valuable personal items (jewelry, firearms, currency)
- Qtr.1 Peak times of occurrence 4:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.
- Qtr.1 Peak Days of occurrence Friday (10), Thursday (6), Monday (6)

Burglary Prevention Safety Tips

Neighborhood safety is a team effort, but it starts with *you*. What can you do to make your neighborhood a safer place?

1. Make friends with neighbors
2. Install security cameras and improve lighting
3. Secure doors, windows, gates
4. Utilize neighbors or sign up for our Vacation Check Program when out of town
5. Be vigilant, communicate with your neighbors about unusual activity
6. Report suspicious activity to the police immediately.
